



DAVIDE CALÌ Cartoonist and author for children, his books have been published in France (Sarbacane, Rue du Monde, Little Urban, ABC Melody, Elan Vert, Gallimard, Actes Sud), Italy (Kite, Edizioni Clichy, Orecchio Acerbo, Biancoenero), Spain (Nube Ocho), Portugal (Bruàa), USA (Chronicle Books, Harper Collins), Canada (Comme des Géants, Tundra Books) and translated in over 30 countries. He has published more than 200 illustrated books, comics



and novels, and has received as many awards in France, Belgium, Spain, Switzerland, Germany, USA. Several companies in France, Belgium, Italy and Japan have adapted his books (*L'ennemi et Moi j'attends*) for children's theatre. He regularly collaborates with several French monthly for children, including "Mes Premiers J'aime lire", "Toboggan" and "Tralalire". He illustrated Paolo Mieli's books, and wrote, designed and illustrated *God Save The Queen* (Centauria). His latest book is *Breve Storia del K-pop* (Salani). His works are awarded and exhibited by New York Society of Illustrators, American Illustration, Creative Quarterly, Communication Arts, 3x3. FRANCESCA GASTONE is an architect and illustrator. Always passionate about all forms of art, photography played a decisive role in her education, to the point of setting up a black and white development laboratory at home. The Polytechnic in Milan then provided her with a design method that from then on she would pour into every aspect of her life. After a master's degree in editorial illustration (MiMaster) she began

collaborating with important publishing houses, newspapers, agencies, private companies and cultural institutions. 
When one thinks of fishes, very often one's mind runs to the great coral reefs, the ocean depths or the polar waters. What emerges, however, is that fishes in rivers do everything they can to amaze us, to go against the odds, to outdo the competition: some walk, some jump, some climb, and it will not be a rock face or a near-desert dune that stops them.

While it is true that many are famous, such as the fearsome piranha or the voracious torpedo, a whole host are virtually unknown, and many are probably still waiting to be discovered.

The bodies of these animals are covered with armoured scales, which make them hydrodynamic and resistant, and with mucus, a protection against infection. **They are ready to do anything to eat and reproduce**: this is how some of the most extraordinary migrations known to date originate, such as that of the eels from the European mountains to the heart of the Atlantic, just to name one, with tens of thousands of kilometres travelled just to lay their eggs.

The advice is not just to admire them in aquariums, but to learn as much as possible about them and, why not, to observe them close to home, perhaps from the top of a small bridge or with mask and flippers if conditions allow it to be done safely.





THE FIGHTER PAR EXCELLENCE

f you have ever visited an aquarium shop, you will surely have seen colourful fish, often red or blue, with large fins that look like veils. They are kept isolated, sometimes in empty containers, and spend their time swimming along the glass, sometimes attacking their own reflection. These are fighting fish, so called because of their extreme territoriality, which makes it impossible or almost impossible for them to coexist with other fish. However, those found on the market always originate from crossbreeding between different species in captivity, which has led to artificial selection in terms of colours and shapes, certainly exaggerated compared to the original ones. Hybrids can easily be obtained in aquariums, but unfortunately, they have been naively released into the wild, with all the ecological damage that this entails. There is nothing to complain about, however, regarding the wild colouring of the Mekong fighting fish (Betta smaragdina): once stimulated by the presence of camoutlaged females, the dark green males become iridescent and metallic, with red fins adorned with electric blue radiating lines.

The eggs are laid in a nest of bubbles, below the surface or among vegetation, so that they remain well oxygenated. Adults can breathe air thanks to the labyrinth organ next to their gills, which consists of a series of vascularised plates that increase the surface area for gas exchange. This adaptation is particularly useful in rice paddies and stagnant waters, where the water can be low in oxygen.



AN ARMY OF MULTI-COLORED SHELLS: CRABS, SHRIMPS AND HERMIT CRABS

Since childhood, crabs, shrimps and hermit crabs have populated the collective imagination: protagonists, in spite of themselves, of catches and observations on the beach or among the rocks, they constitute a surprisingly varied and interesting slice of biodiversity.

Endowed with good eyesight, articulated legs and pincer claws worthy of the best mechanics, they move stealthily from the tidal zone to the ocean depths, but they have been able to extend their dominance beyond the sea: there are crabs that live in rivers, that move in large armies on the ground of tropical forests, migrating en masse, and that even hide inside carnivorous plants.

Some crustaceans, such as the huge thief crab, have colonised dry land and are inexplicably attracted to human objects (which they willingly steal), others are tiny and closely related to other animals. Many crustaceans, in fact, live in symbiosis with anemones, corals, jellyfish, bivalves and fish: to flush them out, it is necessary to know their biology and behaviour, even before their appearance.

Not all of them graze on seaweed or eat dead animals, many are deadly predators: the gun shrimp can deliver some of the fastest blows in the world with their raptorial legs similar to those of praying mantis shrimps, catching fish and invertebrates larger than themselves. They are also noisy: pistol shrimp can produce sounds that are easily audible to the human ear, thanks to their strong claws, which produce an intense shock wave.

This book, with Giulia De Amicis's beautiful illustrations, is a eulogy to the diversity and beauty of crustaceans: an army of multicoloured armour and claws, conquering the boundary between the emerged and submerged worlds.


A SPINY HOUSE

tocky and enlarged, Coleman's shrimp (Periclimenes colemani) is yellowish-white, with wonderful ruby-red spots and stripes, sometimes darker; males are generally smaller and slimmer, and proportionately more ornamented than females. The discovery of this crustacean was very interesting, because of its lifestyle: it is found in pairs on the upper side of a single genus of urchins (Asthenosoma sp.), where it digs a small niche in the tissue to better accommodate itself, eating part of the pedicels and probably mucus, but without causing too much harm to its host. The fact that these echinoderms are equipped with venomous spines explains how, in addition to eating, living in this almost unassailable shelter is totally advantageous for escaping predators. To this we must add that although the shrimp's coloration seems very bright, in its context it perfectly camouflages it among the spines of the urchin itself, which have conspicuous red and white rings, thus contributing to its salvation. This species is highly sought after by underwater photographers, who appreciate taking portraits of the pairs, but also wider, contextualized images by including the urchin in the shots as well.



Eight arms directly attached to the head: this is the main characteristic of the class of molluscs of the cephalopods, which in Greek means 'with feet attached to the head'. Octopuses, cuttlefish and squids are masters of survival, and the most skilful transformers in the oceans: versatile, resourceful and undoubtedly intelligent animals that know how to solve problems and use objects, but also escape from aquaria, recognise people and feel dislike. Some species, such as the *orchid cuttlefish*, are among the most colourful organisms in the oceans, while others, such as the *blue-ringed octopus*, are famous for their lethal bite. The world's largest invertebrates are also cephalopods: giant squids the size of a bus, but about which we still know very little.

In this book you will find 30 species recounted in their most surprising habits and abilities, but also described in their main scientific characteristics, for a double reading plan: an initial part with a fluent and fascinating narration to delve into the secrets of this world, and a practical concluding section, a veritable catalogue of specimen cards, for easy and immediate consultation.

Today we can begin to tell the story of these animals thanks to the work of scientists over the centuries, but **there is still much to be discovered**: octopuses, cuttlefish and squids, after all, are invertebrates that force us to reflect on the way we relate to the planet; their unexpected cognitive capacities suggest that it is not only mammals and birds that produce sophisticated behaviour somewhat similar to ours.




This is why the veined octopus has evolved a curious behaviour: it goes in search of empty bivalve shells, or cracked coconuts, to use as shelter.


When it finds only one half, it carries it around under its body, like a skateboard, and walks quickly using two arms; once it has found the other half, it uses its suckers to adhere to the inner walls and enclose itself in a rigid fortress... ingenious!

The species' common name derives from the fact that it often takes on a dark red colouration with a black reticulate, reminiscent of veins; the suckers are elegantly dyed light blue.

myth: the Mona Lisa can only be described as such. In addition to her smile, her adventurous life, made up of journeys, displacements and an unprecedented theft with the subsequent, darin discovery, also contributed to creating the legend.

It all began in 1503, when Francesco del Giocondo, one of Florence's only prominent citiesen, asks Leonardo to paint the portrait of his thin fife, Lisa Cherardini. She is twenty-four years old and it takes Leonardour years to complete the picture, which he paints on a poplar woo and. He portrays her sitting in front of an immense valley where a rier flows, smilling and placid, her hands crossed in front of her. She let er sweet and melancholic character shine through her gaze and smile. As he is about to finish his work, the king of France summons him his own. In fact, it was customary for every rule to have several re owned artists in his service and to 'sonoror' their works and trovices.

The portrait of Mona Lisa follows the painter to France, Leonardo

ants it close and takes it with him. He arranges in his flats, shows it to those who visit him. Hen, it is not known for what reason, he gives peptraris to the king: perhaps he gives it him; or perhaps it is one of his pupils who list it othe sovereign after his death.


de Fontainebleau, then to the Louvre, which at that time was the royal palace in Paris, and later transferred to Versailles, the palace outside the city. For the Mona Lisa, the moves did not end there: after the French Revolution, it returned to the Louvre, transformed into a public museum; then Napoleon Bonapatre – the general protagonist of so many military campaigns in Europe, appointed Emperor of the French – wanted it for a time in the bedroom of his wife Josephine, but then moved it back to the Louvre.

But it is when Leonardo's masterpice returns to the Louvre that experiences its most dangerous adventure: on Monday 21 August 1911 is stolen by an Italian who worked at the museum, Vincenzo Peruggia. At seven o'clock in the morning, the man mingles with the workers wh come in to work and puts his plan into action. He removes the paintin from its formage of involves in its words his incident.

He then caimly neads for the exit, even asking a worker for neip in pening the door. Once he reaches the street, he even has time to take he wrong tram. Before half past eight he gets into a taxi that takes him irectly to his hotel room, far from the Louvre.

A copyist who arrives at the museum in the morning with permission to reproduce Leonardo's work becomes aware of the theft. At first he cannot believe his eyes: the Mona Lisa room without the Mona Lisa! He raises

Soon the painting destined for Fiesole was admired, welcomed and loved by all the inhabitants of Gdanak?

Tani did not easily resign himself to the loss of his masterpiece an tried to recover the painting, even asking the Pope for help: but even th official protests of the head of the Catholic Church were unsuccessful The work remained in Gdańsk and is still on display there today.

A few years later Tommass Dortinari — who, as mentioned, had organised the voyage of the boat on behalf of Tani — also commissioned an altarpiece from a Bruges painter and sent it to Florence by sea. The second story of 'navigating' works of art can be found at the end of the book: will the masterpiece reach its destination this time?

READABILITY AND TIPOGRAPHY: SCIENTIFIC FACTS BEYOND TRENDS

BOOK

How to design texts, books, and in general any communicative support looking at MAXIMUM INCLUSIVITY to make **reading** increasingly more **DEMOCRATIC**.

Where are we with the scientific evidence on readability?

The need for this book stems from the tendency of typography to take as fact elements that emerge from tradition. For example, "serifs read better than sans," "we read better what we read more," "asymmetrical forms are better for readers with dyslexia," etc.

It is possible (but not proven) that text forms have adapted to the readers and vice versa the readers shaped their reading to the form of the book, but this does not imply that every typographic adage is necessarily correct; indeed, those listed above seem to be just about all of them wrong.

The approach taken in this essay is therefore one that is based on the process called EVIDENCE BASED DESIGN, which in brief is to base design choices on what emerges from scientific research, with the aim of creating the best conditions for the user (in this case reader). In essence, to design better, knowing one more thing is better than knowing one less, if only to avoid setting limits that have no reason to be.

Added to this is the need to make as widespread as possible a practice, reading, that until only a hundred years ago concerned a very small percentage of people, and to understand how reading can be improved by improving the typography.

An essay to discuss the effects of typography on reading in the light of scientific knowledge on the subject.


Set in the animal world, the illustrations by Corinne Zanette are striking for their vivid palette and richness of details, in a perfect marriage with the texts that are quirky and funny.




